# Welcome to 2024 at Lugarno P.S. and to 5/6W.

Thank you, for your support in assisting your child to get all their school supplies and books covered. If possible this should be done by the end of week 4.

This year we will be stressing the importance of being well organised both in class and in relation to homework tasks

A positive and focused approach to one's studies is consistently being reinforced.

This year, years 3 to 6 are using the new DET English and Maths syllabus for the first time. The aim of these two syllabi is to build strong foundations in literacy and numeracy and to give teachers more time to concentrate on deep learning by reducing the hours teachers spend on non-essential learning and compliance requirements. The English syllabus is broken up into the following areas:

- Reading Fluency and Comprehension
- Phonic Knowledge, Spelling and Vocabulary
- Creating Written Texts
- Oral Language and Communication
- Responding to Literature
- Handwriting and Digital Technologies

Mathematics in K–6 focuses on developing students' mathematical understanding, fluency, communication, reasoning and problem-solving through their study of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Space and Statistics and Probability.

These capabilities enable students to respond to familiar and unfamiliar situations, using strategies to make decisions and solve problems relevant to their further education and everyday lives.

In Science & Technology this semester, the students will be looking at how food and fibre are produced sustainably in managed environments for health and nutrition. Digital devices and technology, will continue to be used in class to help facilitate student learning.

Other KLA's include PDHPE where the class will be covering the school values, resilience lessons and the Dragon's *Best You Can Be* program.

In addition to this, in Term 1, Mrs Dufty will teach the digital citizenship component of the curriculum in part of the student's library session this term. On Thursdays, a skills and a game session will take place.

During Term 1, for visual arts we will be experimenting with different drawing and painting and construction techniques. If you are concerned about students getting paint on their uniforms, it is recommended that students bring and wear a paint shirt from home.

In Term 2 we will be doing athletics skills and Term 4 team skills. Please ensure that they are suitably attired for PE sessions.

An overview of all topics covered in all KLA's this year will be provided at our Meet the Teacher information session.

## **Homework**

Homework will be completed on a fortnightly basis, due on the Thursday every alternate week.
All homework can be found online in our Google Classroom.
It is preferable that this Homework is submitted online, however, if this cannot happen, students can submit homework on a paper copy in a display folder.

Please let me know if this is the case. The content of the work given covers numerous KLA's. Teachers will explain this fully to all students with answer templates provided for those in need of assistance.

As well, students should be reading for enjoyment for at least an hour a week.

Homework is an important part of your child's education. Whilst it is not compulsory, it is a good opportunity for you to become involved and spend some time to understand any difficulties your child may be encountering.

Our main aim is for them to become independent learners who are able to find what they need when they need it.
