#### What is PBL?

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an exciting school-wide behaviour initiative. It is a comprehensive, integrated whole school approach to student well-being and behaviour. When working well, it is a process that helps create positive learning environments, enable improved student learning, engagement and self-confidence.

At Lugarno Public School, staff are responsible for teaching the behaviour expectations, providing consistent positive feedback to students, and delivering consistent, corrective feedback and consequences when expectations are not followed. The entire school, including the classrooms, hallways, canteen, school gates and playing areas, are considered part of the total learning environment.

Positive behaviours are identified, acknowledged and reinforced while inappropriate behaviours are seen as teaching opportunities.
