PSSA Sport – Code of Conduct

Our school is fortunate to have so many students who have a passion, interest and talent in sport. Being selected and participating in a PSSA sport, however, comes with expectations and responsibilities for students and parents/carers alike. As we look ahead to the first round of Season 1 this Friday, it is worth highlighting these expectations and responsibilities that students and parents/carers agree to when signing the PSSA Code of Conduct. At LPS we are committed to developing well rounded, respectful individuals who demonstrate sportsmanship and team work. Please take the time to ensure that the Code of Conduct you and your child sign is something that is clearly understood, valued and upheld so that PSSA continues to be an enjoyable Friday pursuit for all where sportsmanship and fair play are the champions.

By agreeing with the following codes of behaviour with your child, we are ensuring a common understanding between students, staff and parents/carers of Lugarno Public School.

Code of Conduct for Players

- 1. Maintain acceptable schoolwork standards.
- 2. Maintain acceptable behaviour standards at school, in class and when you represent the school.
- 3. Be punctual and attend all training sessions. Inform the coach when unable to attend.
- 4. Dress in the appropriate uniform for the sport you play.
- 5. Cooperate at all times with the coach, team mates and the competing school.
- 6. Try to the best of your ability at all times.
- 7. Compete by the rules and always respect and abide by the referee's/umpire's decision.
- 8. Be a good sport. Encourage fellow team members. Play for the fun of it and allow others to enjoy it.
- 9. Control your temper, making no criticism either by word or gesture.
- 10. Behave responsibly while travelling on a bus or walking to and from a venue.
- 11. Sit down and support the other teams whilst not involved in the game being played.
- 12. Conclude each game by congratulating the competing school.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Bad language, sledging and bullying on or off the field is NEVER accepted.
- 14. Be responsible for packing equipment sharing the work.

Code of Conduct for Parents / Carers / Spectators

- 1. Encourage participation by your child/children.
- 2. Encourage honest effort and skilled performance.
- 3. Remember that children play sport for THEIR enjoyment.
- 4. Provide a model of good sports behaviour for your child to copy. Applaud good play by all teams.
- 5. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
- 6. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- 7. Be COURTEOUS in your communication with players, team coach, team officials, game officials and sport administrators and show appreciation for their services.
- 8. Do not interfere with the conduct of any events.
- 9. Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.

Debating Program 2023

Exciting news! We will be continuing with the inter-school debating program. The program is designed to support the development of students' debating skills in a friendly, non-competitive environment with a <u>focus on learning</u>.

We are seeking students in Years 3-6 who have an interest in public speaking and learning the skills of debating. Students need to be able to work well both in a team and independently, be prepared to meet each



week for meetings (Mondays at lunch), have sound persuasive writing skills and also be prepared to do some work between meetings at home.

The inter-school debating program will then consist of four debates In Terms 2 and 3 (two per term), where our debating teams will travel to local participating schools. Our school will also "host" a debate.

The participating schools are:

Lugarno PS, Mortdale PS, Peakhurst PS, Peakhurst South PS, Peakhurst West PS.

If your child is interested in participating, they are asked to <u>return the Expression of Interest Slip to Mrs</u> <u>Androulakis by Wednesday</u>, 22nd February indicating their interest.

Students are asked to prepare a short 1– 1.5minute speech in which they will present their arguments for either side of the following topic on **Monday, 27th February.**

We will be selecting a total of 12 students to make up two teams. Each team consists of four students plus two reserves.

The 2023 LPS debating coaches will be Mrs Harris and Mrs Androulakis. Mrs Williams will be overseeing and coordinating the inter-school debating program.
